

Karron's Korner -

Recently, I've been doing some research on the Gifts of the Spirit – timely in this season of Easter – and I came upon a discussion of the Gift of Tongues that I thought you might find of interest.

The Gift of Tongues, the gift of "Heaven-given languages" allows us to *hear* the Presence of the Holy Spirit. Through this gift, the Spirit is able to speak and pray for us and through us to the Father in accordance with God's will.

Christ told his disciples before he ascended to Heaven that the ability to "speak in new tongues" would characterize his faithful followers. Though we can belong to the Kingdom of God without speaking in tongues by virtue of our baptism, but you will lack the power you would otherwise have for living in God's Kingdom on earth.

Here are some reasons for receiving and using the Gift of Tongues:

- 1) <u>Shows our connection to the Kingdom of Heaven.</u> Builds faith among unbelievers.
- 2) <u>Edifies, builds up and recharges our spirits</u>. We are personally strengthened when we interact with the Father through the Holy Spirit.
- 3) <u>Reminds us of the Holy Spirit's</u> indwelling presence.
- 4) <u>Keeps our prayers in line with the</u> <u>Will of God</u>, and prevents us from praying in selfishness.
- 5) <u>Stimulates our faith</u>, for we know that the Spirit is fully communicating our needs and will trust God more completely.

- 6) <u>Frees us from worldly</u> <u>contamination</u>. When we speak the language of God in the Spirit, we take part in the culture of Heaven.
- 7) Enables us to pray for the Unknown. Because the Holy Spirit knows things we know nothing about, we can intercede for what God wills in His language.
- 8) <u>Refreshes us spiritually</u>. Speaking in tongues relieves our anxiety, mental turmoil and perplexity.
- 9) <u>Helps us give thanks.</u> Though we are unlearned in spiritual things, tongues help us to offer the kind of thanks and praise to God that He deserves.
- 10) <u>Puts the tongue under subjection</u>. By praying in tongues, we put our words under the control of the Spirit of God.

Blessed Ceferino Gimenez Malla (III)

The first Gypsy ever beatified was a martyr and a Secular Franciscan. Ceferino, born in Spain in 1861, had a successful business buying and selling horses. He and his wife had no children, but adopted one of his wife's nieces. He attended Mass frequently and joined the Secular Franciscans.

Always generous to the poor, he was known as a reconciler among Gypsies. In 1936 during the bloody Spanish Civil War, Ceferinoe was arrested for defending a priest who was being dragged through the streets of Barbastro, and for having a rosary. As he stood before the firing squad, Ceferino clutched his rosary and cried out "Viva Cristo Rey!" He was beatified in 1997 by Pope John Paul II.
