#### THE NOVEMBER MEETING


This month, we will be presenting some news about events and celebrations to come as we move into the holiday season.

#### Karron's Korner -

Our Regional Minister, Sylvia, asks us to discuss, promote and evangelize the new initiative of the Franciscan Action Network (FAN) called **The F.R.A.N.C.I.S.**Commitment to Civility in Discourse.

The initiative came out of a realization that political discourse is at an all-time low right in this country, having degenerated into name-calling and character assassination. The result is a legacy of mistrust and hatred that is dividing the country and immobilizing Congress.

As Catholics and followers of Christ, we need to be peacemakers, urging all sides to consider the damage they do to the spirit of this country by spreading nasty rumors and ill-will among its citizens.

FAN asks that we contact elected officials and candidates for office on both sides of the aisle to insist upon a fair, free and friendly level of discourse to help solve the country's problems together as a unified nation.

### St. Agnes of Assisi.

Agnes was the sister of St. Clare and her first follower. When Agnes left home two weeks after Clare's departure, the family tried to bring Agnes back by force. As they dragged her from the monastery, her body suddenly became so heavy that several knights could not move it. The knights then left Agnes and Clare in peace.

Agnes matched her sister in her devotion and her endurance of the strict penances that characterized their lives at San Damiano.

In 1221 a group of Benedictine nuns near Florence asked to join the order. Clare sent Agnes to be abbess of that monastery. Agnes soon wrote a sad letter about how much she missed Clare and the other nuns at San Damiano.

After establishing several convents in northern Italy, Agnes was recalled to San Damiano in 1253 as Clare was dying. She died three months after her sister. Agnes was canonized in 1753.

# The Francis Commitment to Civility in Discourse

Currently in our national conversations on policy we are experiencing a great degree of inflammatory language. It is language which exaggerates differences and hardens positions and language which is provocative in nature and uses violent imagery at times.

For this reason Franciscan Action Network offers some principles for public conversation based on the life of Francis and our Franciscan traditions. Our purpose in proposing these principles is to be mindful of a Franciscan way to promote policy reform and to demonstrate peace in an ongoing process of transformation.

Join our efforts and make the **F.R.A.N.C.I.S.** Commitment to Civility in Discourse. Share it with others and join in the effort to help transform our public conversations in the spirit of St. Francis and St. Clare!

After you have made the commitment below, join other FAN members in contacting your candidates for federal elected office and <u>invite them to adhere to these principles</u> as well in this election season.

Take a quiet moment in prayer and then recite the following out loud or to yourself. Each verb begins with a letter which, when taken together, spells out the name FRANCIS:

## "I commit to:

- **E**ACILITATE a forum for difficult discourse and acknowledge that all dialogue can lead to new insight and mutual understanding.
- RESPECT the dignity of all people, especially the dignity of those who hold an opposing view.
- **AUDIT** myself and utilize terms or a vocabulary of faith to unite or reconcile rather than divide conflicting positions.
- **NEUTRALIZE** inflamed conversations by presuming that those with whom we differ are acting in good faith.
- COLLABORATE with others and recognize that all human engagement is an opportunity to promote peace.
- **IDENTIFY** common ground such as similar values or concerns and utilize this as a foundation to build upon.
- **SUPPORT** efforts to clean up the provocative language by calling policymakers to their sense of personal integrity."
