

# January's Meeting

At our January meeting, Frances Garcia briefed us on the fraternity's financial situation for the year ending 2009, and distributed the approved budget for 2010.

Our records show a serious decline in contributions compared to 2008. We believe this is due to a failure on the part of our members to send in their contributions whether or not they attend the monthly meeting(s).

However, all is not lost. If every member could contribute \$10 per month for 12 months in 2010, the fraternity would be on a firm financial footing. Of course, we recognize there are some who cannot contribute this amount. We also have members who contribute \$20, \$30 and \$50 dollars a month, and ask that they continue to contribute at this level, as there are some members who give at the \$10 level.

What we do expect is that <u>everyone</u> <u>contributes every month</u>. If you cannot attend a meeting, send your contribution with another SFO or mail it directly to the fraternity Treasurer:

## Karron's Korner -

We are now into February, and Lent will soon be upon us. So I am offering a suggestion, for our own lives and our lives in fraternity, that I know you can take to heart.

On TV, I have been watching the pain and struggles of the Haitian people, as well as the outpouring of care and aid to them from all over the planet.

How fine it would be to set an expectation and a clear understanding – in our families, our business, our institutions – for people, above all, to respect one another and be <u>kind</u>. And we, as Christians, can be kind in the Name of Jesus, and for Him, so we will find help to live in kindness.

The easiest way to know God's love is to be loving – in our families, to our pets, to friends and to strangers. Kindness is a demonstration of love. Going out of our way to be deliberately kind, even if it is a little inconvenient, or takes us a few steps out of our way, or postpones our own comfort for a minute or two, is a great work. It is heroic and has effects far greater than we can see or anticipate.

As we bring the Lord with us as our companion, friend and guest, we go forward in His kindness. He will speak to others through us. Though we may think we are small, working in union with Christ gives us tremendous power in Him.

So I propose kindness for Lent in 2010, and then simply keeping it up.

# St. Peter Baptist & Companions

Died at Nagasaki, 5 Feb., 1597. In 1593 while negotiations were pending between the Emperor of Japan and the Governor of \ Philippines, the latter sent Peter Baptist and several other Franciscans as ambassadors to Japan. Well received by the emperor, they established convents, schools, and hospitals, and effected many conversions. When on 20 Oct., 1596, a Spanish vessel of war was stranded on the isle of Tosa, it became, according to Japanese custom, the property of the emperor. The captain was foolish enough to extol the power of the king, and said the missionaries had been sent to prepare for the conquest of the country. The emperor became furious, and on 9 Dec., 1596, ordered the missionaries to be imprisoned. On 5 Feb., 1597, six friars belonging to the First Order St. Francis (Peter Baptist, Martin of the Ascension, Francis Blanco, priests; Philip of Jesus, cleric; Gonsalvo Garzia, Francis of St. Michael, lay brothers), three Japanese Jesuits (Paul Miki, John Goto, James Kisai) and seventeen native Franciscan Tertiaries were crucified. They were beatified 14 Sept., 1627, by Urban VIII, canonized 8 June, 1862, by Pius IX.
