


## February's Meeting

#### Karron's Korner -

As we discussed "The Dream" presentation at February's fraternity meeting and reflected on role as Franciscans, as well as our hopes and aspirations for the Order, some ideas came to the fore.

One was a desire that the fraternity as a group do more work among the poor. We spoke of Eileen Costa's "Ladder to Life" program, and the Hermans' establishing a soup kitchen. Several of us wanted to propose more outreach activities, and all were enthusiastic.

I asked all members to work both inside and outside the fraternity, and mentioned a 'Laundry List' of worthy projects that Council doesn't have the bandwidth to address. I was asked to circulate that list, as there was a lot of interest in it.

Having obtained the approval of Council, I've put our "Laundry List" at the end of this newsletter. I invite you to take a look and see if any one project speaks to you. Ideally, each of them is undertaken by a small group, working together.

In the months to come, we will be examining our Franciscan life and mission in greater depth, as we take the opportunity to share our journey and what it's meant for us.

#### March: - St. Catherine of Genoa (III)

Catherine was born in 1447, the daughter of Giacomo Fiesca, Viceroy of Naples. She was the grand niece of Pope Innocent IV.

At thirteen she asked to enter the convent, but was refused because of her

age. In 1463, the lovely 16-year old wed Giuliano Adorno in a political match. Adorno was unfaithful and squandered his money. Lonely and disappointed in her marriage, Catherine wanted solitude.

In1474, while visiting her older sister, a nun, she experienced a profound conversion. From that time on, her life was devoted to prayer and penance. She had deep mystical experiences and many private revelations.

She worked with the sick poor, tending and clothing them. For twenty-three years, she fasted completely during Lent and Advent, with no adverse effects on her health. Eventually, Catherine supervised patient care at the Genoa hospital, and was appointed the hospital rector.

In the last years of her life, her confessor and several close friends wrote down Catherine's teachings, compiling them in two works: the "Purgation and Purgatory" and the "Dialogues," now spiritual classics.

The only spiritual genius of her time, she affected both Catholics and Protestants with her teaching on the Pure Love of God, acceptance of the divine will, and the teaching on purgatory in this life and next.

Her life circumstances are significant: she was a lay person, a married woman, a mystic devoted to the care of others while involved in daily life, and a good Christian who experienced a second conversion.

Catherine died on the 15th of September 1510, at sixty-three and was canonized on April 30th, 1737.
