

Karron's Korner -

It's often been said of St. Francis that he didn't have a lot of use for theology or learned theories about God, but trusted his direct and immediate experience of our loving God and the workings of the Holy Spirit in his life.

As a consequence, Francis was not a great advocate of "saving for a rainy day" and had little interest in controlling situations or people. In the 12th Century as in the 21st, this attitude might be thought irresponsible, rash, or just impractical. But few people in any century enjoy the intimacy that Francis had with Jesus.

St. Francis modeled his life on the Jesus he worshiped: spontaneous, loving, generous, gracious and forgiving. Awed by God's generosity, all Francis saw and heard, tasted and touched were signs of His loving care. Every day was a gift, a new experience of this infinite love. Francis never ceased giving thanks, never failed to praise and glorify God for His goodness.

Francis sought to do as Christ did, and the Gospels tell us Christ acted according to the Father's will in all things. Francis followed Jesus' counsel and example: he prayed, fasted and gave away all he had in order to realize God's plan for his life. Moment to moment, as we open to Him, God speaks to those who hear and gives new insight to those who see.

If we truly wish to do God's will, we must have our ears and eyes opened to the workings of God through the Holy Spirit.
Attuning our spiritual senses keeps us alert

and allows us to respond with confidence and a certainty when God calls.

Blessed Luchesio & Buonadonna (III)

Luchesio and Buonadonna, a married couple, wanted to follow Saint Francis. They helped set the SFO in motion.

The couple lived in Poggibonzi, where he was a greedy merchant. In 1213, Luchesio's meeting with Francis changed his life. He undertook many works of charity.

Luchesio and Buonadonna wanted to live in the world as a married couple and share a religious life outside the cloister. To satisfy their desire, St. Francis set up the Secular Franciscan Order (SFO). Francis wrote a simple Rule for the Third Order; In 1221, Pope Honorius III approved a more formally worded Rule.

Their charity drew the poor to them, and, like many other saints, they seemed never to lack the resources to help these people.

One day Luchesio was carrying a crippled man he'd found on the road. A frivolous young man came up to ask, "What poor devil is it you are carrying there on your back?" "I am carrying my Lord Jesus Christ," responded Luchesio. The young man immediately begged forgiveness.

Luchesio and Buonadonna both died on April 28th 1260. He was beatified in 1273. Local tradition refers to Buonadonna as "Blessed," though the title has not been officially given.
