

HAVE A HAPPY NEW YEAR!

Our JANUARY MEETING on the 9th - Fraternity Elections!

Here we are – the New Year has rolled around again, and we find ourselves in the 2nd decade of the millennium – Welcome to 2011!

This is our first newsletter of the New Year – and the last one I'll be composing, as my tenure as Minister – and the tenure of our entire Council – comes to a close on January 9th with the election of a new Minister and Council.

Yet this comes as no surprise – we have been planning for this change, as each of us has prayed for guidance on God's plan for the fraternity and for ourselves as members and contributors to life in fraternity.

So before coming to the January meeting a week from now, please be sure to ask the Lord for guidance once again, as we pray His Will be carried out in our election.

This year, the nominating process went extremely well. As we requested, nearly everyone nominated themselves for a position on the Council, before nominating brothers and sisters to fill those seats. This was a good and useful exercise, as it allowed each of you to move into the

positions you'd chosen for yourselves and be there a while.

Eventually, when it came time to accept or decline nominations for council seats, you'd already imagined yourself in those positions, and could make a thoughtful assessment about which seats you might be called to fill. And as I spoke with each of you – most often by phone but sometimes via email, I got a sense of your deep commitment to the fraternity.

I've enclosed a list of Council positions and the members who have accepted nominations for them. If your nominee is not listed here, it is because he or she has declined to be nominated for that position.

Some of us are unable to run for Council now due to health issues or caring for ill family members. Others have served on the Council for some time, and requested a break, and some have schedules that preclude reliable attendance at Council meetings.

May God guide us in this election, and grant His inspiration and guidance to our fraternity these next three years!

All fraternity elections are conducted under the auspices of the Region, to assure they are fair and free, and follow procedures set out by our Constitutions and by National. This year, our Regional presider is Tuan, assisted by Bob. The Church witness is the Regional Spiritual Assistant, Rock.

I urge everyone in our fraternity – eligible voter or not – to participate. Just as we conscientiously made our nominations, it is now time to choose a Council to move us forward in the next three years. It's important to cast your vote – this is your community. And for those who are not yet eligible to vote, to understand the election process.

I leave the Office of Minister feeling that our house is in order. The fraternity is solvent, new members are in training, and we've a great program for initial and ongoing formation.

But there is much yet to do. We need to find and foster SFO vocations in younger people. We need to be better schooled in Scripture, in our Franciscan tradition, and to embrace ministries that serve the lepers of our society, even though it's far more comfortable to stay in church.

May God bless and guide the incoming fraternity Council, and may we all continue to grow closer to God through this growing, lively, and Spirit-filled fraternity!
