The Catholic Prayer Book
By Rev. Fr. Robert Fox
Published in 1972

Lord, of the ages, Lord of the Nations, Lord God Almighty. Give me a heart to understand others' point of view. Widen my vision beyond the narrow confines of my little world to embrace the horizons of knowledge and love that scan all boundaries.

There is no man or woman, no teenager, no child, from whom I cannot learn something. Each person, young or old, black or white, yellow or red, is a unique creation of God. And Lord, the God of Love, You made each one of us with our unique personality, with unique bodily characteristics, because you loved us. And to each one of us you have said, "I have loved you with an everlasting love."

God You talk to us in everything and in everyone. The beauty of Your World which tells of Your existence and Your power, we sometimes mar with our excessive living and our uncharitableness toward other persons created in Your own image and likeness. Lord, deliver me from polluting the beauty of Your world and the gifts of Your creation. Lord spare me from failing to see You in the face of every man, woman, and child that I shall ever meet.

Too often dear Lord, we do not recognize You in the goodness of Your creation. We fail to see You in the faces of certain people because their skin is colored different from our own. We are more blind than the blind, who in their love for one another are not bothered by the color of skin.

To often dear Lord I do not appreciate the view of one that is older. His vision may be deeper and wider than my own. Too often dear lord I do not comprehend the view or one who is younger. His vision is fresher, bolder, more courageous than my own.

Too often dear lord, I do not appreciate the view and the custom of one whose culture is different from mine. Different cultures penetrate your goodness and beauty, Your wisdom and knowledge, from angles I have never seen or known. I could learn to know and to love more from (the) cultures of others. Instead dear Lord, I recognize Your beauty and Your Goodness in limited color, in restricted goodness and narrow views.

Help me God of Love to blend Your freshness and fortitude in youth with Your wisdom and experience in age. Help me recognize the fuller beauty of Your persons in persons of various colors. Bless me dear Lord with knowledge and a love that is tempered by age, wisdom, culture and You God in Christ Jesus, Who are all things to all men. Amen

Have You Seen the 'Habit' of a Secular Franciscan?

...if you have not seen a Secular Franciscan's habit then perhaps you are not looking at us the way you should look.

As far as outward sign, Secular Franciscans wear...

- a Tau Cross, metal or wood- which can be found pinned on the their jacket, blouse or shirt or hanging from a chain or cord about their neck.
- or some choose to wear a ring with the Tau Cross on it. This ring is generally worn on the right ring finger, as their wedding ring is on the left hand.

This visible symbol reminds all of our commitment to God and to the Secular Franciscan Order.

Secular Franciscans also wear other things, however, if you are looking at the material items such as clothing then you will miss seeing them.

If you want to see the habit then you must look:

- into their eyes there you will see the shinning glow of hope.
 This hope is a belief that there is a Heaven and the hope we will be with our loving savior when we leave this earthly world.
- At their smiles a sign of happiness and joy in the life we have chosen serving God and our smiles knowing that God loves all.
- In to their hearts there you will see the love and compassion for all those they minister to and for God.

You must also listen. Listen to:

- their laughter one cannot help laughing with people about the joys of life especially when God is always tickling their hearts.
- their voices for in their words they share the Good News of the Bible, the prayers within their hearts, the love we have for God and the stories of St. Francis of Assisi (their founder).

These are just a few items of our "Franciscan habit." Perhaps it is not the habit people are looking for but I know one thing. It is a habit that we clean, repair and change easily through prayer, retreats and fraternity life. It never wears out; it is contagious and is truly an outward sign of our love of service and commitment to God in the footsteps of St. Francis.
