Holy Gospel for Pentecost Sunday 2017 cycle A

R. Alleluia, alleluia.

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

GOSPEL JN 7:37-39

Jesus stood up and exclaimed,
"Let anyone who thirsts come to me and drink.
As Scripture says:

Rivers of living water will flow from within him who believes in me."

He said this in reference to the Spirit that those who came to believe in him were to receive.

There was, of course, no Spirit yet, because Jesus had not yet been glorified.

Advice from St. Anthony of Padua to the Laity on Contemplation (Image: Maso di Banco, *St. Anthony of Padua*, first half of the 14th century)

St. Anthony of Padua (1195-1231), a Doctor of the Church, carries the nickname "the ark of the covenant" for his deep knowledge of sacred Scripture. His preaching was known for its beauty and sweetness. But in his humility, he declined offers to teach until he received written permission from St. Francis himself. St. Francis happily gave that permission!

At our May gathering, we enjoyed an inspiring, challenging talk by Fr. Barnabas Hughes, OFM. We continue to learn that the great Franciscan theologian, St. Anthony, offers much more than help in finding things!

Among the insights of St. Anthony to us are these gems:

- "The just person passes through the transitory love of this world with the cross of Jesus and thus reaches the promised land with two gifts: the fruits of the active and of the contemplative life."
- ❖ "When the mind of a person stands face to face with God and contemplates His beauty and tastes its sweetness, then he is truly in the garden of delights... The sweetness of contemplation . . . arises from the Creator's love."
- ❖ Having entered my home I will rest with her (Wisdom), because being in her company there is no bitterness nor bother in our living together, only happiness and joy. Spiritual persons leave aside mundane concerns and disturbing thoughts to enter into the home of their consciences, closing the door upon the five senses. They relax with Wisdom, leaving themselves empty for the divine contemplation, in which one savors the quiet of spiritual sweetness.

Summary of Laura and Carol experience at the Regional Day of Reflection on St. Bonaventure on 5/7/17

While the SLR Fraternity was enjoying our May Fraternity meeting, Carol and Laura were in San Diego engaged with our larger Franciscan family. Carol and Laura met brother and sister Franciscans from across our District at the Nuestra Senora De Los Angeles church. The Nuestra Senora Fraternity provided a very warm welcome including wonderful refreshments and a beautiful 'environment' table to complement the parish hall where we met. Two of our Regional Spiritual Assistants, Sylvia Paoli, OFS and Margie Rodriguez, OFS were scheduled to speak on 'an Understanding St. Francis through the Eyes of St. Bonaventure.' It was a delightful surprise to arrive and learn that they were specifically focusing on Bonaventure's work, a 'Soul's Journey Into God.'

Sylvia and Margie shared that several years ago they had been on a week-long residential retreat focused on this incredible work of St. Bonaventure. That experience was transformative for each of them, really changing their spiritual lives. It helped them to see all creation with a new perspective – with all creation being a gateway into God. They provided some brief highlights of this great spiritual work, primarily in seeing the 'vestiges' of God, or 'footprints' of God in all of creation and how that connected with the central theme of Franciscan spirituality, the Incarnation.

The day was a wonderful reminder that we would all benefit from a deep dive into Bonaventure's work. For the brave, you can access a full written online translation online.
