The Pastoral Visit:

"A Privileged Moment of Communion"

Dear brothers and sisters,

This month we have the opportunity to experience a life-giving aspect of our shared vocation – the pastoral visit. Sylvia Paoli, OFS, our Regional Spiritual Assistant, will join us for our entire day together on November 4.



Our canonically established fraternity is a kind of "person" in the eyes of the Church. And a visit to check on our spiritual health is good for our fraternal personhood!

A Spiritual Assistant can be a member of the First Order/TOR, of the Second Order (Poor Clares), or of one of the Orders of sisters who follow the TOR rule, or a trained Secular Franciscan, or a diocesan or other priest or deacon. Our Regional Spiritual Assistants are assigned by the Provincial of the St. Barbara Province, Fr. David Gaa, OFM, or his delegate.

Before November, I urge you to read carefully the passages below. They are from Article 95 of our Order's General Constitutions, and describe the meaning of a pastoral visit.

- 1. The pastoral visit is *a privileged moment of communion* with the First Order and the TOR. It is carried out also in the name of the Church and serves to guarantee and promote the observance of the Rule and the Constitutions and fidelity to the Franciscan charism. ...
- 2. Having verified the canonical establishment of the fraternity, the visitor will give attention to the relations between the fraternity and its spiritual assistant and the local Church. ...
- 3. The visitor will promote collaboration and a sense of co-responsibility among the secular leaders and the religious assistants. The visitor is to examine the quality of the spiritual assistance given to the visited fraternity, encourage the spiritual assistants in their service and promote their continuing spiritual and pastoral formation.
- 4. The visitor will give special attention to programs, methods and experiences of formation, to the liturgical and prayer life, and to the apostolic activities of the fraternity.

Pope Francis invites us to 'Share the Journey'

November 10th at 9am starting at the Mission San Luis Rey Parish Serra Center



<u>Pope Francis</u> launched the '<u>Share the Journey</u>' campaign to transform the culture of indifference that exists about the 65 million migrants and refugees fleeing violence, extreme poverty, and injustice - to a culture of encounter.

Fr. Vince Mesi, OFM, pastor of Mission San Luis Rey Parish, Bishop Dolan of the Diocese of San Diego, along with the USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops), CRS (Catholic Relief Services), CCUSA (Catholic Charities USA), and Caritas Internationalis invites us to Share the Journey.

Our event for the Diocese of San Diego will be:

- What: A gathering with inspirational talks, including by <u>Bishop Dolan</u>, an Eucharistic procession/pilgrimage on the Mission grounds, and a concluding prayer & refection in front of the historic <u>Old Mission San Luis Rey</u>.
- Where: Starting at Mission San Luis Rey Parish Serra Center located at 4070
 Mission Avenue, Oceanside, CA 92057 just east of the historic Old Mission.
- When: Saturday, 11/10/18 from 9am-Noon. Coffee & Refreshments provided.

Why: To answer the Pope's call to walk with our brothers and sisters who are migrants and refugees in solidarity and love - <u>to Share the Journey</u>









Holy Gospel for 31st Sunday in Ordinary time

Gospel MK 12:28B-34

One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with al I your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these."

The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself' is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions.

Commentary from St. Joseph's Sunday Missal © 2011

The scribe states" [Love for God and neighbor] is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." This is a Jewish hyperbolic (exaggerated) saying for: "Sacrifices that are routine and void forms have no value." Isaiah makes the same kind of strong statement (Is 1:13). The meaning is that formalism and void symbols in religion are worthless. The conclusion, however, is not: "Stop praying and worshiping!" Rather the clear lesson is: "Love God in your neighbor and show him/her your love directly in meaningful prayer and worship!" Do both and your love will be lasting.

Reflection from our Editor: Do we think of this "Golden Rule" before we open our mouths, even in political matters. All persons, even those with opposing views are to be loved, as we love ourselves.






