Upcoming Gathering on June 3, 2018



SAINT FRANCIS REGION - LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM

What is this leadership we are called to all about? Why is it important to our fraternity? Should I consider going? Diane and I have been participating in the current program. Participants were recently asked by the Region to share our experience with our local fraternities. Donna has agreed to this request and thus we will be spending a little time at our meetings over the next few months to share about our experience at the leadership program. In June we will share an overview of the program. We hope that this will answer some of the above questions and spark your interest in participating in future opportunities as well.



First of all, at our recent profession last month we were all reminded that each of us at our own profession asked to be admitted to profession of the Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order and to live a Gospel life in the footsteps of Saint Francis. If we take a close look at Rule 21 to which we professed it states "Each fraternity is animated by a council and minister marked by a ready and willing spirit and is a <u>duty</u> of responsibility to each member and to the community. Article 32 of the General Constitution further clarifies that "The ministers' and counselors' task to lead is temporary."

Therefore, it is the <u>duty</u> and responsibility of each member of the fraternity to be open to leadership within the fraternity as guided by the Holy Spirit. You might be thinking but I am not qualified! Remember though, the Holy Spirit does not only select the "qualified" the Holy Spirit qualifies those He selects. It is our responsibility to do our part however, to prepare ourselves via ongoing formation and opportunities like the leadership training program to more fully understand the current Rule and direction of our Order so that if called by the Holy Spirit to leadership we can in fact be servant leaders with His guidance.


We are trusting that with the Holy Spirit's guidance our sharing will be a blessing both for us and the fraternity.

Scripture Reflections



Choose a word or phrase of the Scriptures you wish to pray. It makes no difference which text is chosen, as long as you have no set goal of "covering" a certain amount of text. The amount of text covered is in God's hands, not yours.

Read. Turn to the text and read it slowly, gently. Savor each portion of the reading, constantly listening for the "still, small voice" of a word or phrase that somehow says, "I am for you today." Do not expect lightning or ecstasies. In *lectio divina*, God is teaching us to listen, to seek him in silence. God does not reach out and grab us but gently invites us ever more deeply into his presence.

Ponder. Take the word or phrase into yourself. Memorize it and slowly repeat it to yourself, allowing it to interact with your inner world of concerns, memories, and ideas. Do not be afraid of distractions. Memories or thoughts are simply parts of yourself that, when they rise up during *lectio divina*, are asking to be given to God along with the rest of your inner self. Allow this inner pondering, this rumination, to invite you into dialogue with God.

Pray. Whether you use words, ideas, or images—or all three—is not important. Interact with God as you would with one who you know loves and accepts you. Give to God what you have discovered during your experience of meditation. Give to God what you have found within your heart.

It is not necessary to assess the quality of your *lectio divina*, as if you were "performing" or seeking some goal. *Lectio divina* has no goal other than that of being in the presence of God by praying the Scriptures.

Gospel: **Feast of Corpus Christi** Mk 14:12-16, 22-26

On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover.

While they were eating, he took bread, said the blessing, broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take it; this is my body." Then he took a cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank from it. He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which will be shed for many. Amen, I say to you, I shall not drink again the fruit of the vine until the day when I drink it
