

Minister's Note for June

The Franciscan family since the earliest of times has had many branches. The diversity of Franciscan communities seems to be part of our history and our DNA. One big, beautiful, ancient branch of the Franciscan Family is the Secular Franciscan Order. The Secular Franciscan Order was one of the three Orders founded directly by St. Francis of Assisi. There are about 350,000 active Secular Franciscans globally today. I especially like this Franciscan Family Map that includes our Anglican brothers and sisters. 2

We've recently had guests joining us at our Fraternity gatherings including Fr. David Gaa OFM, the Minister Provincial of the Franciscan



Province of St. Barbara and Sr. Kathy Warren OSF, the Director of Women Religious for the Diocese of San Diego. Both shared a similar message regarding Secular Franciscans, 'Now is a GREAT time to be a Secular Franciscan; the world needs you!' This Secular Franciscan vocation of ours is a beautiful *gift*, something for us to be continually unwrapping, cherishing, and putting it to service in a world that is *so* terribly in need of it.

Thomas of Celano in his first Life wrote: "Many people, well-born and lowly, cleric and lay, driven by divine inspiration, began to come to Saint Francis, for they desired to serve under his constant training and leadership... To all he gave a norm of life and to those of every rank he sincerely pointed out the way of salvation".³

During this year especially, our 800th anniversary as an Order founded by St. Francis of Assisi, let us hold our brothers and sisters in prayer and seek to bring this beautiful vocation of ours out into the world. Though JPIC (Justice, Peace, and the Integrity of Creation) we have outreach into all sorts of ways to help heal the world. Through bringing our Franciscan charism into all our ministries and interactions. It would seem to me that it is our job, like St. Francis and St. Claire before us, to be the face of God to those on the margins of society and to all that whom we encounter.



Mother of the Disappeared

An **icon** is an image that comes to us from the Eastern and Orthodox traditions and is much more than art; it is a prayer form. Icons are referred to as being prayerfully 'written' rather than 'painted' and used as a teaching tool using symbolism to reveal its truths. I feel an attraction to the icon, "Mother of the Disappeared" as a contemporary version of the Sorrowful Mother image by Br. Robert Lentz, OFM. I invite you to visit his website to view his many icons, especially those of Francis, including Francis and the Sultan. Lentz is known for incorporating contemporary social themes. Was he was inspired by our Franciscan challenge to live the Gospels when he chose to create icons of St. Oscar Romero, Dorothy Day, and many unknown subjects, including non-Christians?



In the icon "Mother of the Disappeared," Br. Robert portrays Mary as sharing the lot of the downtrodden and standing in solidarity with them. The icon honors the tens of thousands of Latin American mothers whose family members were "disappeared" by death squads in the 1970's and 80s. In 1976 Argentinean mothers began a silent protest in front of government offices wearing black dresses and white kerchiefs, carrying photographs of their missing loved ones. They wore a white rose if they hoped their loved one was alive and a red rose if they were dead. This march then spread to El Salvador, where Oscar Romero was martyred in 1980.

Br. Robert Lentz describes the layers of meaning in this new icon of the Madre Dolorosa. Mary wears the white kerchief of the Argentinian mothers and her Byzantine garment is almost black, matching theirs. Rather than a photograph of her son who was *also* abducted by a death squad, she holds his crown of thorns. She wears both red and white rosebuds, since she is Mother of all the Disappeared.

The white handprint is the signature of the El Salvador death squads and was intentionally added to the icon. The icon has in essence been violated, but this detail expresses a deep truth. The death squads violate icons of God every time they abduct and torture a human being. As Franciscans we should let the words of St. Oscar Romero burn into our hearts. "I am a shepherd who with his people has begun to learn a beautiful and difficult truth: **Our Christian faith requires that we submerge ourselves in this world**" (my bolded emphasis)

A hauntingly beautiful musical reflection is the song 'Mother of the Disappeared' by the Irish rock band, U2. The song is featured on their 1987 album, The Joshua Tree. The song was inspired by lead singer Bono's experiences in Nicaragua and El Salvador in July 1986. The proceeds from the song were donated to Amnesty International.



How does Article 13 of our Rule challenge us to go deeper?

"As the Father sees in every person the features of his son, the firstborn of many brothers and sisters, so the Secular Franciscans with a gentle and courteous spirit accept all people as a gift of the Lord and an image of Christ.

A sense of community will make them joyful and ready to place themselves on an equal basis with all people, especially with the lowly for whom they shall strive to create conditions of life worthy of people redeemed by Christ. In November 2002 Pope John Paul II addressed Franciscans at the Tenth General Chapter. Quote taken from his letter:

"You must deepen the true foundation of the Worldwide Fraternity and create everywhere the spirit of welcome and the atmosphere of brotherliness. Commit yourselves firmly against all forms of exploitation, discrimination, marginalization, and against all attitudes of indifference towards others."

Does this not sound like it came from the lips of our current Pope Francis?

Let us move forward in ongoing conversion each day to know how our rule and Our Lord wants us to make a difference for those who suffer so many kinds of injustices and violence today. Mary, Madre Dolorosa, pray for us.

<u>Fratelli Tutti-Chapter 5 A Better Kind of Politics</u> is one truly at the service of the common good. The question then is, can universal fraternity and social peace exist without sound politics?

Today, it is difficult for someone to express a viewpoint on any subject due to a divided society. Populism disregards the legitimate meaning of the word "people." To be part of "People" is to be part of a shared identity advancing toward a common project. Popular leaders can be unhealthy when interpreting the feelings and cultural dynamics of people. May it be the greatest desire of all individuals to advance processes of justice for all.

Pope Francis has no intention of proposing an irresponsible "Populism" and welfare projects should be temporary. The biggest issue is EMPLOYMENT to be able to use individuals talents. It's the best way to help the poor. We need to allow them a dignified life through work. Work is an essential dimension of social life. It gives a sense of shared responsibility for the development of the world, and ultimately, for our life as a "people."

For reference, here's a list of <u>Laudato Si'</u> goals with brief explanations. In the months to come, I hope we'll have ample opportunity to discuss them.

Laudato Si Goals - https://www.laudatosi.org/laudato-si/

- <u>1. Response to the Cry of the Earth</u> Greater use of clean renewable energy & reducing fossil fuels in order to achieve carbon neutrality, efforts to protect & promote biodiversity, guaranteeing access to clean water for all, etc.
- <u>2. Response to the Cry of the Poor</u> Defense of human life from conception to death & all forms of life on Earth, with special attention to vulnerable groups such as indigenous communities, migrants, children at risk through slavery, etc.
- <u>3. Ecological Economics</u> Sustainable production, Fair-trade, ethical consumption, ethical investments, divestment from fossil fuels & any economic activity harmful to the planet & the people, investment in renewable energy, etc.
- **4. Adoption of Simple Lifestyles** Sobriety in the use of resources & energy, avoid single-use plastic, adopt a more plant-based diet & reduce meat consumption, greater use of public transport & avoid polluting modes of transportation, etc.
- <u>5. Ecological Education</u> Re-think & re-design educational curricula & educational institution reform in the spirit of integral ecology to create ecological awareness & action, promoting the ecological vocation of young people, teachers & leaders of education etc.
- <u>6. Ecological Spirituality</u> Recover a religious vision of God's creation, encourage greater contact with the natural world in a spirit of wonder, praise, joy & gratitude, promote creation-centered liturgical celebrations, develop ecological catechesis, prayer, retreats, formation, etc.
- **7. Emphasis on Community** Involvement & participatory action to care for creation at the local, regional, national & international levels (promote advocacy & people's campaigns, encourage rootedness in local territory & neighborhood ecosystems, etc.
