Minister's Note:

I hope you have been blessed with an abundance of spiritual gifts during this graced season!

As we pause and reflect in this season of joy, let's think a bit about the word 'epiphany.' 'Epiphany' is an "Aha!" moment; the moment when a person is struck with a life-changing realization that can often begin with a small, ordinary experience.¹



Francis had such an epiphany. After suffering defeat in battle, his imprisonment in Perugia, and his failure as a knight, Francis was deeply struggling. Eventually he set out *again* to become a glorious knight, this time in the Papal Army – but had a dream in which he heard a voice, 'Francis, which is better, to serve the master or the servant?" He replied, 'Why, Sir, the master of course.' Francis then heard the voice instruct him to return to Assisi where it would be shown to him what he was to do. On the way, Francis encountered a leper. Rather than steering clear out of revulsion and concern for his own safety, Francis dismounted his horse, overcame his terror, and approached the leper. Francis gave the leper both money... *and a kiss*. Something incredible happened inside Francis at that moment. He had a joyous 'Aha!' moment, an epiphany – *he saw that the face of the leper was the face of Christ.*²

As we each reflect on the Epiphany, where wise travelers from distant places became witnesses to the Incarnation of God in

the child Jesus – this infant who was a divine King. Let us also look for the small 'epiphanies' in our own lives. Like Francis, let us reach out to the marginalized with not only concrete assistance, but also with love.

My husband and I were young newlyweds when on our honeymoon we first saw the musical production of Victor Hugo's 'Les Misérables.' It could have been that graced honeymoon time when it is so very easy to float on love... we looked at each other with tears as it was sung, 'to love another person is to see the face of God.' In that moment, we received a gift – an 'Aha!' moment for our young marriage (well, that song and another by Elvis, the 'King of Rock and Roll,' but that's another story). May we all reach out to others with love, have the courage to put fear aside, and to 'work Mercy.' I pray that we're open to epiphanies in our own lives – and like Francis did as he encountered the leper with love – to see the face of God.

Yes we are having a 'Regular Gathering' after lunch, so please stay for it.



Holy Gospel for Epiphany (A)

Gospel MT 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod. behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them. until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.
